#### Youth to Men

Students participating in the Youth to Men Mentoring Program are encouraged to prepare themselves to be leaders in their schools, homes, churches, and communities.

The mentees and mentors are bound together by three principles; Brotherhood, Unity, and Service. Each academic year, a class of students and families are interviewed and recruited from approximately 20 Cobb County Area Schools.

The program places an emphasis on the progress of each individual student, community service activities that focus on teamwork and leadership, teen pregnancy prevention, law enforcement, positive mental health, paid internships, and workforce initiatives with an emphasis on career development.

#### **STEM Immersion Summer Institute**

In Partnership with Kennesaw State University, College of Computing & Software Engineering

Our mission and purpose is to provide a best-in-class STEM Immersion experience to prepare our young men for future possibilities and careers in STEM related fields. This immersion institute offers participants a unique experience that prioritizes technical instruction, experiential hands-on learning, skill building, and an exciting week of events and competition on a college campus. The curriculum emphasis is focused on Robotics, Artificial Intelligence, and Cybersecurity.


## Foundation Investment in Leadership Development

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


#### Future Business Leaders of America Campbell High School
